Ongoing Surveys and Consultations

- Amendment to Annex IV and V POP Regulation:
 - The Commission has opened for feedback a <u>Proposal for a</u> <u>Regulation amending Annexes IV and V to Regulation</u> (EU) 2019/1021 of the European Parliament and of the <u>Council on persistent organic pollutants</u>.
 - Please provide us with your feedback until 3rd December 2021.
- General Block Exemption Regulation (GBER):
 - 6th October, the Commission has opened the public consultation on the <u>draft General Block Exemption</u> <u>Regulation (GBER)</u>.

- It widens up the scope of existing provisions on aid for recycling and reutilisation of waste, by also covering investment aid for other investments that aim at increasing the level of resource efficiency or contributing to the transition towards a circular economy.
- FEAD has prepared a <u>draft response</u> and sent it to members. Please provide us with your feedbacks by the 15th of November.

FEAD attended the Ad-hoc meeting of the CAs for the REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals) and CLP (Classification, Labelling and Packaging) Regulations (CARACAL) on Annex VIII and Online Sales, on the 27th of October 2021. Monitoring of EU Institutions

Life of EU institutions

- new regulatory framework for batteries:
 - 3rd November 2021: The European parliament's IMCO Committee is scheduled to consider compromise amendments on 8 November 2021.
 - FEAD is preparing replies to the work of the ENVI committee of the European parliament.

<u>Classification for environmental toxicity of lead:</u>

 ECHA (European Chemicals Management Agency) finalised a proposal opinion indicating that lead in metallic formshould be classified as very ecotoxic for the environment. In particular, this means that any material containing more then 2.5 ppm of lead (be it under massive or powder form) would be classified, if the proposal is adopted, while the List of Waste Regulation (2000/532/EC) currently explicitly exempts metal alloys in their massive form from the concentration limits set in Annex III of the WFD on hazardous waste.

- This would have consequences on: recycled aluminium used in primary production, tin recycling, zin scrap recycling , lead-acid batteries recycling , classification of residues
- 9th November: exchange between the ILA and stakeholders (online) on next steps.

Press Review & Reports

<u>COP26:</u>

On 31st October 2021 the UN climate change conference started in Glasgow. Main points so far are:

- Methane pledge: The EU and the US officially launched their <u>initiative to cut methane emissions</u> by 30% in the next decade. The pledge has gained the support of 103 other countries. In total, signatories represent two-thirds of the global economy. <u>Here</u> you can find the Commissions press release.
- Push for carbon pricing: At an event earlier this week, von der Leyen stressed the importance of the EU emissions trading system in driving down emissions, and briefly discussed the Commission's plans for a carbon border adjustment mechanism (CBAM). See the review of the event <u>here</u>.
